## Chaplain Chats with Cynthia

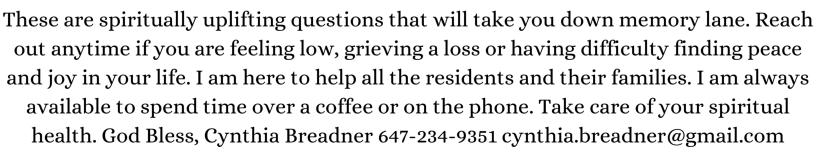

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### "Our Street" Lighthearted Short Stories By: Volunteer "Maggie B"



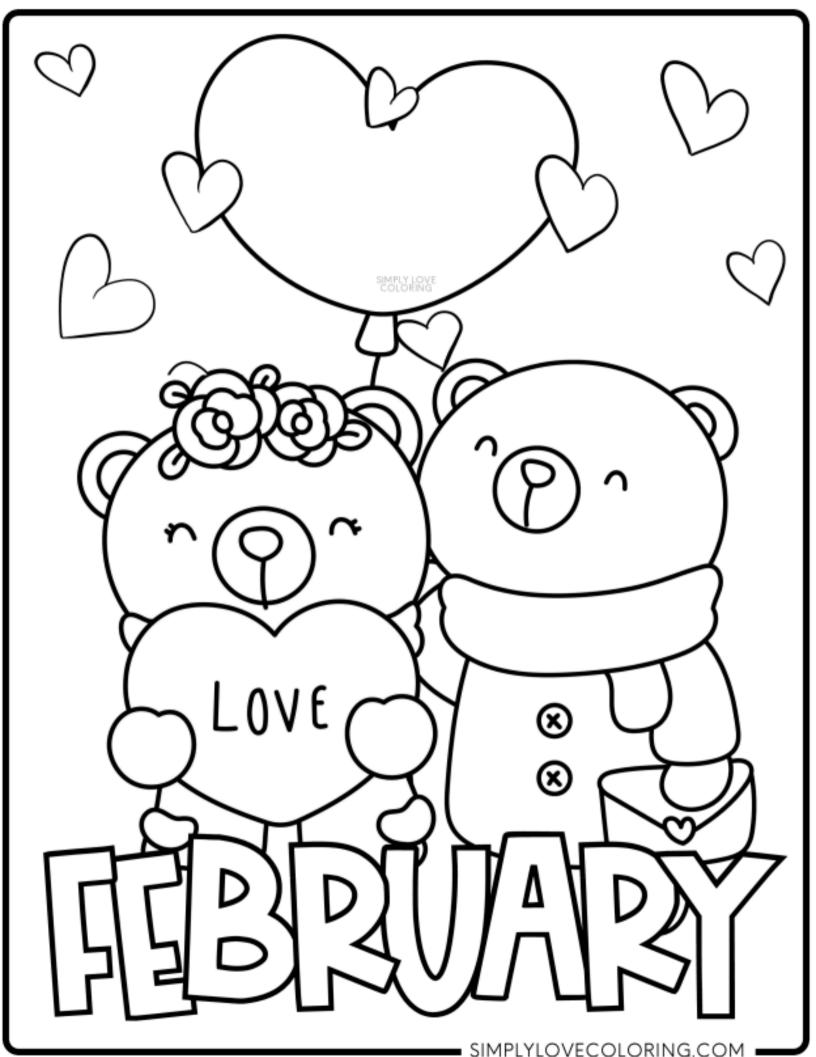

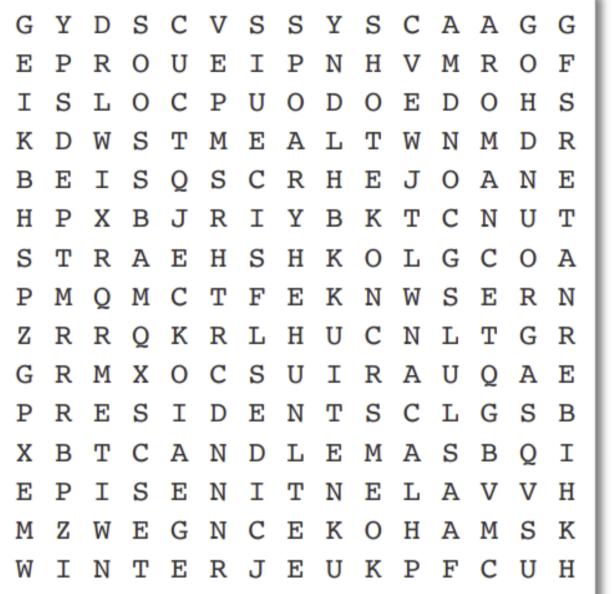
